UNDERGROUND WALKS INTO THE DRIFT MINE

10.45 and **11.15am** - Please book **IN ADVANCE** via the NCM Reception Desk (01924 848806) and specify "**geology tour**" when booking. Numbers are restricted to 10. This walk includes a long and steep walk **down** the drift accompanied by a geologist so will be longer than the usual museum underground tours.

SURFACE WALKS 10.30, 12noon and 2pm. Accompanied walk (about 1 hour) from the Museum (Cafeteria doors) to the Hope Mine rock exposure to see a coal seam and marine band. It includes a brief visit to the fossil collection in the Blacksmith's workshop and an opportunity to enter the Hope Pit tunnel. Maximum group size 12.
